If the top has a scratch deeper than a 120 grit paper would make, you need to either spend more time at the initial step or start with a rougher grit paper.


SANDING STEPS

- **STEP 1:** Remove any dirt from top. Best results will be achieved with a dustless vacuum like a Festool system.
- **STEP 2:** Depending on depth of scratches begin sanding with 120 or 150 grit paper. It is important to follow the sanding path "North South, East West" as detailed below for each sanding step.
- **STEP 3:** Sand with 180 grit and clean top with denatured alcohol or water.
- **STEP 4:** If scratches remain, Repeat Step 3. Note: Always clean top after sanding.
- **STEP 5:** Sand with 240 grit and clean top with denatured alcohol or water.
- **STEP 6:** Sand with 320 grit and clean top with denatured alcohol or water.
- **STEP 7:** Inspect top, If all scratches have been removed, finish top with a gray scotch Brite pad.

North – South, East – West Sanding Pattern

Starting in a corner and sanding in rows. Make sure to overlap the previous sanding disc track by 1/3rd. This will ensure you do not miss any part of the surface. Repeat this sanding pattern until all scratches are removed and or you have achieved desired finish level.



Remember, if the Corian[®] color is slightly darker like Cocoa Brown, and the finish looks to dull or blotchy, you may want to sand it up a step or two; and then buff with a gray scotch Brite pad. The extra steps will brighten the color and clear up the finish. To test your finish, clean the top using a wet rag or sponge, add soft scrub cleaner to the rag (not on the top). Clean in a circular motion. Rinse the soap off, dry with a towel. If the finish is unchanged by the cleaning, it is correct.

Note: use a vacuum sanding system for best results. Also, grit size and steps may vary depending on the brand of paper you use. You may be able to skip a step if your paper performs better. Not all sand paper works the same.
